I, on the other hand, swooned over John Derek. I don't know if Janey knows it or not, but Jeanette was allowed to name the "new" baby and, of course, named her Jane. Jeanette was a quiet, kind and a good friend for many years. Although we drifted apart after high school, as often happens, I would get to see her from time to time and it was a sad time when Fred died.
