Anita L. Wolgemuth, 92, of Woodcrest Villa, Lancaster, formerly of Mount Joy, PA, went home to be with her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, on September 30, 2025. She is survived by D. Jay Wolgemuth, her husband of 68 years. She was born on February 14, 1933 in Mount Joy, PA, the daughter of J. Guy and Clara (Shatto) Myers.

Anita was a graduate of the former Mount Joy High School, class of 1951, and a graduate of the former William Jennings Bryan University, Dayton, Tennessee, class of 1956. Early on she was employed by the Mount Joy Paper Box Company as bookkeeper and later by the former Maytown Elementary School as teacher. A homemaker most of her life, she was involved with children's ministries and active in the local Christian Women's Club, serving on the executive committee and guiding Friendship Bible Coffees.

Anita was a member of Calvary Bible Church, Mount Joy, who dearly loved and faithfully prayed for her family. She enjoyed reading, art, music, travel, and the ministry of sending cards.
