“ I first met Barbara when I moved to Lancaster after graduating from West Chester U. I was just getting started as a composer and Barbara was among the first to appreciate and sing some of my concert (art) songs in public. She also introduced me to her circle of area musicians. An adventurous traveler as well as an excellent soprano, she enabled my first trips to California (and Disneyland) and to Europe when she was studying voice in Milan, Italy. Shortly thereafter she began singing professionally in Italy and Austria, the start of a promising vocal career before returning to the U.S. She was also fluent in several languages and taught German. I'm now living in California where (fortunately) she visited my partner and I shortly after we moved here. The last time we performed together was at her alma mater, Dickinson College: "An aria from *The Consul*, by Giancarlo Menotti. Barbara Thome Bagri (Class of '61) as Magda, Ross Care, accompanist." She also sang the role in the Lancaster Opera Company production and continued to work in musical theater. (As the Mother Abbess in *The Sound of Music* she nightly brought down the house with *Climb Every Mountain!*) Thank you, Barbara, you were a big influence on my musical life and my life in general and a wonderful friend.
