Barbara Esposito of Vineland passed away peacefully on February 25th at the age of 96.

Born on December 26, 1929, to Irene and Charles Bernasconi, Barbara dedicated her life to caring for others — first as a nurse, and always as a devoted mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother.
