George P McConnell, 73 of Maytown, PA, entered the church triumphant on Thursday, March 5th, 2026, after a lengthy illness. George was born in 1952 in Columbia, PA, to the late George W. and Ruth (Friend) McConnell.

After graduating from Donegal High School in 1971, George served in the US Air Force from 1972 through 1976. He completed basic training in Texas then served as a medic stationed at Loring Air Force Base in Maine. He continued his service in the Airforce reserves stationed at Dover Airforce Base in Delaware until 1978. In 1982, he graduated from York College with a BSRN degree and began his career as a registered nurse. For more than 32 years he worked for Masonic Village in Elizabethtown until he retired.

He was married 43 years to Victricia (Bippus) McConnell. Surviving in addition to his wife Vicki are his three children George J. McConnell of Austin, TX, Daniel McConnell of Maytown, PA, and Amanda (Chris) Ghaffarian, of Bloomington, IN and his sister, Ruth Ebersole of State College PA.

George loved minions, sending people flowers, cards and balloons to make their days brighter, creating floats for Christmas parades, participating in Relay for Life, and volunteering with Habitat for Humanity building houses.

George was an active member of St John's Lutheran Church in Maytown and was often found volunteering in the kitchen cooking chicken corn soup.

George will be laid to rest at Maytown Union Cemetery at a private ceremony.

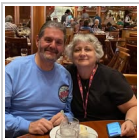
