Herbert B. Frey, 86, of Mount Joy, passed away at his residence on Wednesday, January 17, 2024. Born in Mount Joy Township, he was the son of the late J. Harold and Vera (Brubaker) Frey. Herb was the husband of Lucille (Hershey) Frey, with whom he celebrated 63 years of marriage. Herb attended Hempfield High School. He and his brother, Harold, were self-employed farmers. He also owned Herb Frey Trucking, hauling grain to many different mills until 2014. Herb was a member of Mount Joy Mennonite Church and also attended Community Bible Church in Marietta. As a member of the 4-H Club and the Flying Dutchman Hunting Club in Sullivan County, Herb enjoyed tractor pulls, drag races, hunting and watching the Phillies. Surviving in addition to his wife, Lucy, is a son, Terry Frey, husband of Belle of Mount Joy; a daughter, Connie Tempest, wife of the late Roddy of Durham, NC; four grandchildren, Vanessa Vastyan, wife of Dan of Cody, WY, Adam Frey, husband of Patricia of Elizabethtown; Gabriel Tempest and Caroline Tempest of Durham, NC; a sister, Janet Weber, wife of John of Lititz; and a brother, Harold Frey, husband of Barbara of Mount Joy. Proceeding Herb in death was his daughter, Corinne, and his sister, Nancy Frey Hershey. A private memorial service will be held at Community Bible Church.
