James M. Brandt, 86, of Mount Joy, passed away at on May 27th, 2017 after a brief illness. Jim was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church of Mount Joy. He was an avid sailor and was often found on the waters of the Chesapeake Bay in his wooden Chris Craft boat. He also enjoyed spending time at his friend's cabin in Mifflinburg and hunting with his late son Scott. Always a smile on his face, Jim was often a jokester and will be remembered for his special personality.

A resident of Mount Joy all his life, he was the son of the late Albert G. and Verna Brandt. He is also survived by a brother Robert Brandt of Elizabethtown. He was preceded in death by his son Scott in 1994 and a brother Lloyd Brandt.
