



Msgt John J. Huncher Jr.

April 19, 1956 - August 17, 2025

Msgt John J. Huncher JR USMC Retired, 69, of Mount Joy, PA, passed away peacefully on August 17, 2025, at his family home; after a valiant 2-year battle with pancreatic cancer.

Born April 19, 1956, In Baltimore MD, John was the son of John SR and Joan Huncher. Raised in Dundalk MD, where he demonstrated early resolve, graduating from Patapsco High School and immediately answering the call to service with the United States Marine Corps.

Msgt Huncher honorably served in the United States Marine Corps from July 7, 1975, through July 31, 1996, retiring after 21 years of dedicated service to his country. Msgt Huncher served with distinction during deployments during the Gulf War and Somalia.

A steadfast husband and father Msgt Huncher is survived by his wife Lucinda, children: John, Justin, and Katie, 5 grandchildren: Kyle, Nicole, Justin, Logan, and Connor, and his best buddy "Leo". Msgt Huncher was predeceased by his parents John and Joan, and countless brothers in arms that relied on his leadership, friendship, and shared his dedication to service.
