Luke E. Gerber, 92, formerly of Mount Joy, passed away on Friday, April 4, 2025 at Luther Acres in Lititz. Born in Lancaster, he was the son of the late Harry S. and Naomi W. (Hoffer) Gerber. Luke was the loving husband of the late Mary (Shelly) Gerber who passed away on May 3, 2020. They had a son, Gregg who passed away before him.

Luke proudly served in the United States Army during the Korean War, and later took a career as a printer at Continental Press.
