Nancy Jane Kopf died peacefully at Lancaster General Hospital on November 19, 2021 at the age of 73 from complications with diabetes.

Nancy was born on December 16, 1947 in Columbia, Pennsylvania to Walter Clarence Marley and Sarah Elizabeth Marley. She was preceded in death by both her parents, her husband Tom Kopf (Lancaster, PA), and her brother Ron Marley (Mount Joy, PA). mentoring young girls as a Troop Leader for Girl Scouts of America. Nancy also greatly enjoyed cross stitching and working with ceramics. Before her retirement, Nancy worked for ten years as a receptionist at Xquisite Nail Salon & Day Spa.
