Virginia passed away on September 8, 2022, in Lancaster, PA, where she had lived happily at Magnolias of Lancaster for the past 1 ½ years. After moving from Athens in 2012 she lived for 8 years with a daughter in Greenville, NC followed by briefly living with another daughter and son-in-law in Mount Joy, PA. Born in Pelham, GA on December 12, 1925, Virginia was the daughter of Albert Whaley and Pearl Ott Whaley. She was educated in the Pelham School Systems and graduated from Pelham High School in 1942. She received a Bachelor of Business Administration in 1946 from the University of Georgia. After graduation, she was employed in what was then The School of Journalism. In later years she was employed in the Office of the Dean of Women, the Institute of Behavioral Research and the Graduate School. She spent most of her life in Athens, GA, which she called home. Virginia was preceded in death by her husband, Glen, of 60 years, and by her son James (Jimmy).

She is survived by daughters, Jan Perkins (Doug), and Judy Easters (Stan) and 7 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. She is also survived by sisters Christine Reeves and Miriam Newton. Burial will be next to her husband and son in Evergreen Memorial Cemetery in Athens, Georgia.
