



Warren Henry Greenawalt Jr.

June 4, 1925 - January 30, 2025

Warren Henry Greenawalt Jr., 99, of Mount Joy, passed away on Thursday, January 30, 2025 at Lancaster General Hospital. Born in Mount Joy, he was the son of the late Warren H. Sr. and Anna Mary (Geltmacher) Greenawalt. Warren was the husband of the late Nancy (Pyle) Greenawalt who passed away on December 7, 2016.

Warren was a graduate of the former Mount Joy High School class of 1943. He proudly served in the United States Navy during WWII and was stationed on the island of Tinian best known as the take off site for the Enola Gay. After his military discharge, he worked as a watch repairman for Bernhard Jewelers in Lancaster, PA. From there he worked as a Senior Model Maker for The Hamilton Watch Company in Lancaster, PA and then as a Diemaker for the former AMP, Inc. in Mount Joy, PA. He retired in 1989.

After retirement he joined the Miniature Carousel Builders Club where he served as a member of the Board of Directors. Warren was also a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church, the Mount Joy Historical Society, a life member of the Mount Joy American Legion Post 185, Big Chiques Bow Club, the Sampson Navy Veterans, and the Mount Joy R/C Flying Club.

Warren is survived by a daughter, Nancy Jo Greenawalt of Stroudsburg, PA. A graveside service with military honors will be held at Henry Eberle Cemetery, 280 Lumber Street, Mount Joy, PA 17552 on Tuesday, February 4, 2025 at 2 PM.
